Self-Assessment Guide for a Safe Event

This guide helps you evaluate potential risks related to sexual violence and unintentional intoxication during your event. The following questions aim to identify critical points and guide you on the measures to implement.

Is your audience safe?	YES	NO
Does your event take place in the evening?		
Is it held outdoors?		
Does it span multiple days?		
Is alcohol sold on-site?		
Does it host more than 300 people?		
Is there a possibility that some attendees might use drugs during your event?		
Does your target audience include teenagers or young adults?		
Have there been past incidents of sexual violence or unintentional intoxications in previous editions?		
Do participants often consume large amounts of alcohol?		
Are adjacent areas (parking lots, campsites, forests, etc.) poorly lit or unsupervised?		
Are there camping areas adjacent to and used during your event?		
Does your event coincide with a national holiday or other celebration? (St. Jean Baptiste Day, New Year, etc.)		
Are you and your colleagues paid for organizing the event?		
Is an "afterparty" planned?		
Does the event feature "festive" music performances?		

Result Analysis :

- **0 to 5 "YES" answers:** Your event presents a low risk, but it is important to remain vigilant, as sexual violence can occur even in low-risk contexts. You are not required to implement all the measures from the Festif & Safe program, but we strongly recommend listening to the pre-recorded training and displaying the visuals provided in the toolkit to raise awareness among your audience.
- **6 or more "YES" answers:** Your event presents a moderate to high risk. In this case, we encourage you to implement as many measures as possible from the Festif & Safe toolkit. These actions will help ensure the safety and well-being of your attendees.
