The safety of all festival-goers is important to us. That's why we collaborate with local organizations to provide you with a festive space where all participants can feel comfortable and safe.




Here, we have zero tolerance for aggressions.

Act quickly: you can offer a distraction, ask for help from another person, or intervene directly if you feel able to.

Respect your limits and do not put yourself in danger.

Be in solidarity with the victim: listen to them, and allow them to go to a space where they feel safe. And above all, **believe what they tell you**.

Report the situation to volunteers, intervention workers or security. In case of an emergency, dial 911



The project is brought by the TCFGÎM

Our feminist vision:

The Table de concertation féministe de la Gaspésie et des Îles-de-la-Madeleine aims to transform social power relations (dominant-dominated), with a view to developing egalitarian relationships between all people.



It brings together several areas of expertise

The project is being designed and carried out in collaboration with CALACS la Bôme Gaspésie, Mi-Chemin and the Regional Public Health Department of Gaspésie–Îlesde-la-Madeleine.



It aims to prevent sexual assaults

Prevent sexual assaults, such as those committed under the influence of alcohol and drugs, and involuntary poisoning in festivals and festive spaces in Gaspésie and the Magdalen Islands.



It promotes the nonvictimization of people

The measures are both collective and individual but with a non-blaming aim towards the victims.



It promotes the culture of consent

We define and promote the culture of consent rather than the culture of rape.



It aims to support festive spaces

It combines awareness, training and on-site presence.

Types of support: reflections, training, communications, displays, presence at festivals.

- Contact a friend or family from the victim if she wants to
- Make sure the victim is in the care of a responder before leaving.
- Share the information you have about the situation to the site manager

If you witness harassment or an assault:

- **Distract**: If you see someone in distress, step in before the situation escalates by distracting the harasser's attention. You can ask them for the time, directions, or even pretend to know them.
- **Delegate**: If you don't feel comfortable intervening alone, ask someone else for help.
- **Document**: If you have your phone with you, consider recording or photographing the scene. Be sure to discreetly note the date, time, and location so this information is included in the footage. This is not for sharing on social media but to provide evidence the victim can use if they choose to file a complaint.
- **Direct**: Depending on the situation and without putting yourself in danger, you can directly address the victim or the harasser, asking the harasser to stop and leave.
- **Dialogue**: Once the harasser has left, approach the victim to reassure them, let them know they are not alone, and ask if they need anything. Be careful not to overwhelm them and explain that the harasser's behavior is not normal and absolutely not their fault.
